

## Blues Scales

Here are a few Blues Scales. These scales are very useful to make up your own tunes for Rock songs and some Pop songs.

Here is an extended version of 'C' Blues Scale, which is the scale for "Rock 'n Roll Man". You can use the notes from this scale to make up your own solo to play with the backing track.

### C Blues Scale extended
